KASICH SIGNS FOUR BILLS INTO LAW

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

Sub. HB 95 (Hill) renames certificates recognizing the delivery of a stillborn infant as certificates of birth resulting in stillbirth;

Sub. HB 144 (Kunze) includes alternative nicotine products within the restrictions that currently apply to the sale or distribution to, and possession or use by, minors of cigarettes and other tobacco products;

Sub. HB 202 (Blessing) makes changes to the examination, reporting, and educational requirements of professional engineers and surveyors;

Am. Sub. HB 19 (Thompson) renames portions of several highways in Ohio as follows:

- Part of Interstate 77 in Tuscarawas County as the “Army Corporal Keith Nepsa Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 3 in Knox County as the “U.S. Army Specialist Ryan A. Martin Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 101 in Erie County as the “Sfc. Charles L. Adkins Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 19 in Sandusky and Seneca counties as the “Lance Corporal Jeremy S. Shock Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 45 in Columbiana County as the “Corporal Ernest G. Madden Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 676 in Washington County as the “U.S. Army Specialist Allen Nolan Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 7 in Jefferson County as the “U.S.M.C. Sgt. Nathaniel Shae Rock Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 43 in Portage County as the “Spc. Adam S. Hamilton Memorial Highway”;

- Part of State Route 51 in Ottawa County as the “Officer William J. Hetrick Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 725 in Montgomery County as the “Marine Corporal Paul W. Zanowick II Memorial Highway”;
- Part of State Route 55 in Miami County as the “Pfc. Jeffrey L. Rice Memorial Highway”;
- Part of Interstate Route 270 in Franklin County as the “Lt. Miroslav Steven Zilberman Memorial Highway.”
