KASICH SIGNS FIVE BILLS INTO LAW

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

Sub. H.B. 170 (Johnson & Stinziano) provides for increased access to naloxone, ensures English proficiency in licensed practitioners of Oriental medicine and acupuncture, permits certain nurses seeking prescriptive authority to complete a portion of their study through Internet-based study, and declares an emergency;

Sub. H.B. 342 (Brenner & Driehaus) permits an educational service center to be a partner or the lead applicant of an education consortium seeking a grant under the Straight A Program. It also modifies the goals of projects supported by the program, makes other changes regarding the operation of the program, and declares an emergency;

Am. Sub. H.B. 44 (McClain) requires the Director of Health to develop protocols regarding the authority to administer, deliver, distribute, or dispense drugs during certain public health emergencies;

Am. S.B. 186 (Hughes) creates the "Knights of Columbus" license plate;

Am. S.B. 209 (Manning) designates a portion of State Route 58 within Lorain County as the "Sgt. Louis Torres Memorial Highway" and designates a portion of Interstate Route 270 in Franklin County as the "Army Specialist Nicholas E. Zimmer Memorial Highway."
