KASICH ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT TO BARBERTON MUNICIPAL COURT

COLUMBUS – Today Gov. John R. Kasich announced the appointment of Todd M. McKenney of Akron (Summit Co.) to serve as a judge on the Barberton Municipal Court. McKenney will assume office on April 21, 2014, and must run in November 2015 to retain the seat for the remainder of the unexpired term, which ends December 31, 2017. McKenney is replacing Judge Christine L. Croce, who was appointed to the Summit County Court of Common Pleas, General Division.

McKenney received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Hiram College and earned his juris doctorate from The Ohio State University Moritz College of Law. Since 2013, he has served as an attorney at Leiby, Hann, Rasnick, Towne, Evanchan, Palmisano & Hobson, LLC.

McKenney previously served as Summit County Court of Common Pleas Judge in the Probate Division and also as State Representative for the 43rd Ohio House District. He previously has practiced law at McKenney & Gingrich Co, LPA and Black, McCuskey, Souers and Arbaugh. He served as judicial law clerk to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, as councilman at-large for the New Franklin City Council, and as Mercy & Justice Pastor at The Chapel. McKenney has received the 2013 Liberty Bell Award from the Akron Bar Association, the Ronald Fowler/Knute Larson Allies Award from Love Akron in 2013, and the 2005 Outstanding Service Award from the Office of Student Affairs at the University of Akron.
