KASICH ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT TO KETTERING MUNICIPAL COURT

COLUMBUS – Today Gov. John R. Kasich announced the appointment of Frederick W. Dressel of Centerville (Montgomery Co.) to serve as a judge on the Kettering Municipal Court. Dressel will assume office on May 19, 2014, and must run in November 2015 to retain the seat for the remainder of the unexpired term, which ends December 31, 2019. Dressel is replacing Judge Robert L. Moore, who passed away.

Dressel received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Ohio University and earned his juris doctorate from The Ohio State University Moritz College of Law. Since 1993, he has practiced law at Ruffolo, Stone & Dressel and has served as acting judge and acting magistrate for the Kettering Municipal Court since 1995.

Dressel previously served as Acting Magistrate for the Vandalia Municipal Court and as assistant public defender for the Montgomery County Public Defender's Office. He has served as legal product analyst and acquisition coordinator at Mead Data Central and as law clerk in the office of John A. Dicke in Denver, Colorado. He has been recognized as Outstanding Citizen Advocate of the Year by the Centerville Education Foundation and received the Appointed Council Special Recognition Award from Montgomery County. An active member of the community, Dressel has served in a number of roles including precinct captain for the Montgomery County Republic Party, mock trial coach and advisor at Centerville High School, member of the Dor-Wood Optimist Club, member of the Americana Festival Committee, and coach for many youth baseball and basketball teams. Dressel lives with his wife, Moira Dressel, and their three children in Centerville.
