More than 500 new job commitments were celebrated in Wilmington on Thursday in an event sponsored by Ohio's governor at Southern State Community College's north campus.

"I know the Lord is smiling today," said Gov. John R. Kasich before a crowd of approximately 90 local officials and key business leaders. "The sun is rising again in Wilmington, but it isn't even close to noon. You have to keep pushing higher and higher in the sky before it reaches its zenith and, when it does, we will be restored here in this town."

The event brought together leaders from companies which have made commitments to either locate or expand in Wilmington.

State's deals help lure 528 jobs to southwestern Ohio

Seven corporate placards hung from a ceiling inside the local community college: Six belonged to companies pledging to create jobs here, and the seventh was for Gov. John Kasich's JobsOhio.

Dozens of people packed a room at Southern State Community College yesterday to celebrate the recent announcements of 528 new jobs and \$18.7 million in new payroll. It was good news for this economically ravaged southwestern Ohio community, where the closing of DHL's freight hub in 2009 cost Clinton County, which has about 42,000 people, more than 8,000 jobs. Each company creating the jobs is getting financial incentives from the state secured by JobsOhio.

"JobsOhio played a big role," said Stu Kemper of Dublin, the chief executive officer of TimberTech, a deck and railing manufacturer that was approved for a 50 percent tax credit for eight years to create 85 jobs in Wilmington.

Ohio governor celebrates jobs to recovering city

Ohio's governor joined in a celebration of a southwest Ohio city adding new jobs as it slowly recovers from a steep downturn during the recession.

Governor John Kasich, business leaders and local officials gathered Thursday at Southern State Community College to draw attention to commitments to create more than 440 jobs around the city of Wilmington by a variety of employers over the next three years.

"You don't want to make a bunch of promises and not deliver. They've had a tough time," said Governor Kasich.

The city became a national focal point for demonstrating how badly some communities were hit during the recession. When DHL moved its delivery operations out of the Wilmington Air Park, thousands of jobs left a county of about 42,000 people.

Work has been rebounding at the air park and other companies are expanding or adding Wilmington operations.
