KASICH ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT TO THE GREENE COUNTY PROBATE COURT

COLUMBUS – Today Governor John R. Kasich announced the appointment of Thomas M. O’Diam of Beavercreek (Greene Co.) to serve as a judge on the Greene County Probate Court. O’Diam will assume office on August 5, 2013, and must run in November 2014 to retain the seat for the full term commencing February 9, 2015. O’Diam is replacing Robert A. Hagler, who retired.

O’Diam received a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture from The Ohio State University in 1981, and earned his juris doctorate from the University of Dayton School of Law in 1985. Throughout his career, he has practiced in the areas of estate planning, estate administration, business organization, succession planning and real estate law.

O’Diam is an executive board member for the Boy Scouts of America, Tecumseh Council, and has provided *pro bono* legal counsel to the Greene County Community Foundation since its inception in 2000. O’Diam and his wife, Deanna, have three children, Nicholas, Brittany and Lindsey.
