**KASICH SIGNS EIGHT BILLS INTO LAW**

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

**Am. SB 40** (Kearney) designates November as "Complex Regional Pain Syndrome Awareness Month" and to require the Department of Health to include on its web site information regarding the syndrome;

**Sub. SB 130** (Hughes, Cates) regulates certain dog breeding kennels and dog retailers;

**Am. SB 135** (Kearney) designates the month of September as "Craniofacial Acceptance Month";

**SB 199** (Smith) designates October 13 as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day;

**Am. SB 300** (Manning, Wagoner) designates the bridge spanning the Vermillion River, that is part of State Route 113, as the "Staff Sgt. James P. Hunter Memorial Bridge" and to designate a portion of State Route 800 in Harrison County as the "Trooper George Conn Memorial Highway";

**Sub. SB 301** (Burke, Cafaro) revises the law regarding the enforcement powers of certain health care professional licensing boards, regulation of pain management clinics, limits on prescriber-furnished controlled substances, and classifications of certain controlled substances;

**Sub. HB 365** (Beck, Dovilla) allows taxpayers who claim an enhanced federal income tax depreciation deduction to reduce the amount of the deduction the taxpayer must add-back for Ohio income tax purposes if the taxpayer increases payroll in the year the enhanced federal deduction is taken by at least ten per cent over the preceding year; and

**HB 423** (Gonzales) provides for the dissolution of a joint recreation district.
