Lt. Gov. Taylor starts work to corral business regulations

COLUMBUS — When Custom Culinary in Avon started making a soup for a national restaurant chain, the company had to buy about 1,300 kegs of beer at retail prices to follow both Ohio laws and their soup recipe.

State liquor law forces food processors such as Custom Culinary to purchase alcoholic additives through retail outlets and often bottle by bottle.

Lt. Gov. Mary Taylor used Custom Culinary's dilemma as a prime example of how the state needs to revamp its business regulations so that they make more sense.
