THE HISTORY OF TSA


- In 1998 a group of Toledo area art supporters and educators came together to discuss the feasibility of starting an arts school under the newly passed community school law. In September of 1999 they opened Toledo School for the Arts, a public community school with 127 students and six full-time staff, in a rented space in a former downtown hotel.
- The real inspiration came from the realization that creative children learn when the arts are infused into academic lessons.
